English

In Literacy, we will cover the following units of work: Float, Leon and the Place Between (poetry), The Diary of a Ninja Cat, Letchworth topic, The Day the Crayons Quit, Shackleton's Journey and Mixed. Throughout the term, we will focus on the importance of sentence structure and use ambitious vocabulary to create a vivid image for the reader. The children will take part in spelling and Guided Reading tasks, which in turn will develop both their vocabulary and comprehension skills.

Mathematics

We will continue to consolidate our basic number and place value skills whilst practicing addition, subtraction, multiplication and division calculations. This term we will also introduce the method used for long division. In order for the children to be increasing fluent in Maths, we will be focusing on knowing the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables and associated division facts. In this term, the topics of Measures and Money will be covered. In daily Maths Fluency, we will also recap on shape, angles and fractions.

Computing

We will be learning all about how the internet works and what a web address and network is. We will learn to use the internet to safely run searches and teach the children about the importance of e-safety.

History/Geography

As part of our 'local area study', our topic will be Letchworth this term. We will be learning about both the history and geography of our town. We will explore why it is called a garden city and will identify the importance of green spaces and land use. We will create our own 'new' town for the future.

Science

In Science we will continue learning about the human body, looking at the human skeleton essentially and the muscles. We will then be exploring forces, including magnetism and will be planning and conducting investigations to refine our scientific enquiry skills.

Art & DT

We will be exploring pneumatics (system using air pressure) as a method of designing and making our own moving monsters.

Music

In Music, we will be exploring more performance poetry, pulse and rhythm using body percussion and instruments. We will be extending our musical vocabulary to be able to describe pitch, dynamics and rhythm.

RE

In RE we are continuing to learn about Christianity and Islam. We will explore key aspects of these religions including their main principles, beliefs and traditions.

PE

We will be developing our throwing, catching and batting skills to begin to play competitive games.

French

Building on our work in the previous terms, we will be extending the numbers we can count up to, learning the days of the week and writing the date. We will be learning to talk about our families and begin to use phrases to tell people more about us.

PSHE (Learning for Life)

We will look at the importance of being part of a community and the wider world.

Learning Milestones – Summer 2021

Learning Commitments are targets that parents will engage with at home with their children in addition to your child's weekly homework. These may be life skills, academic skills or topic linked skills, which the children are going to need to develop over the course of the term.

Work towards your child securely knowing the times tables 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 10 and the related division facts.
