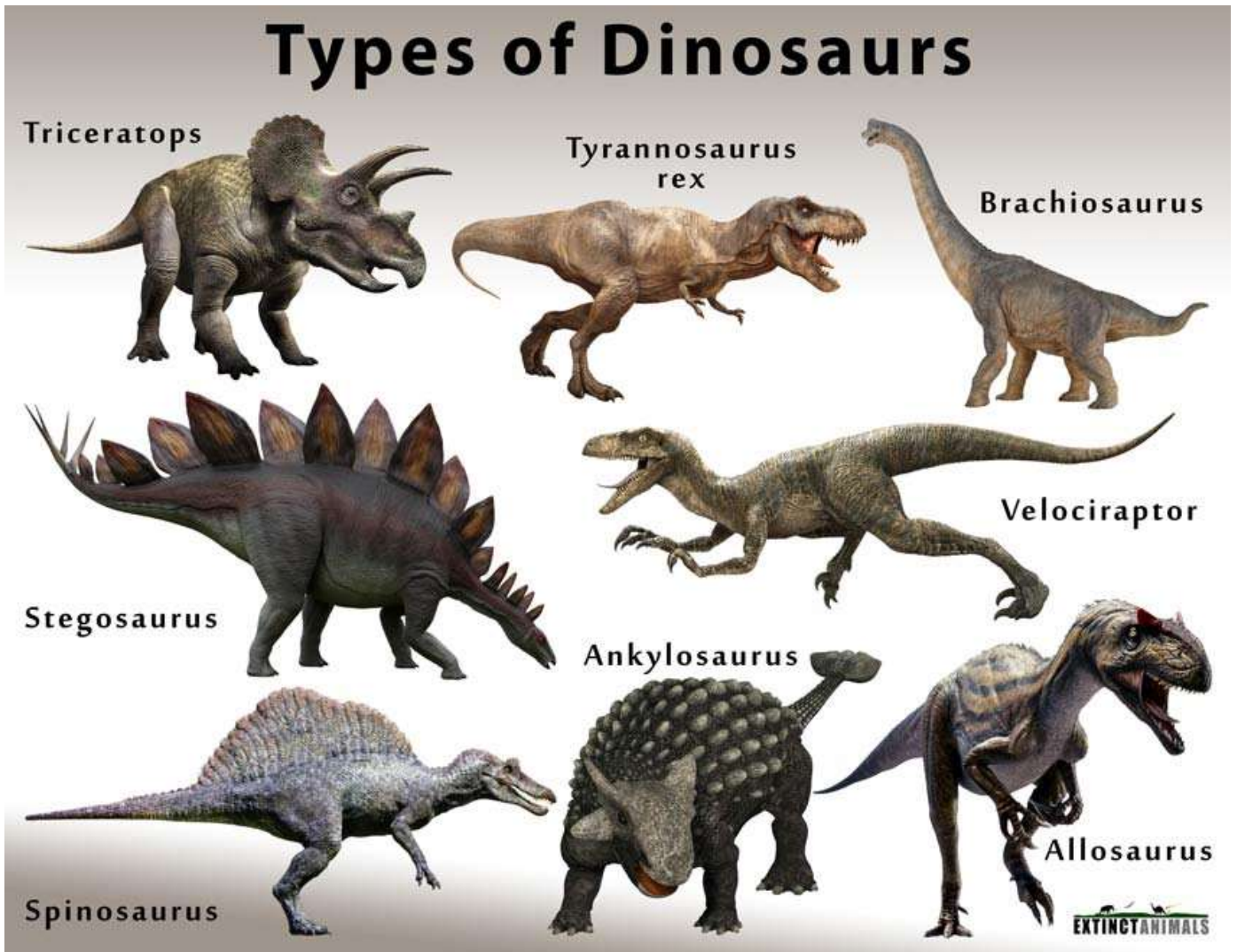


Instructions Writing Unit - Week 2

Lesson 1

Have you ever dreamt of having a pet dinosaur? Today, you will create your very own dinosaur! You may want to combine features from different dinosaurs, e.g. the body of a Spinosaurus with the head of a T-Rex. Have a look at some of the dinosaurs below for inspiration....



Task

Make a detailed drawing of your creature and label its features, remembering to include **adjectives** (words to describe a noun), e.g. **long** claws, **short** legs and a **spikey** tail.

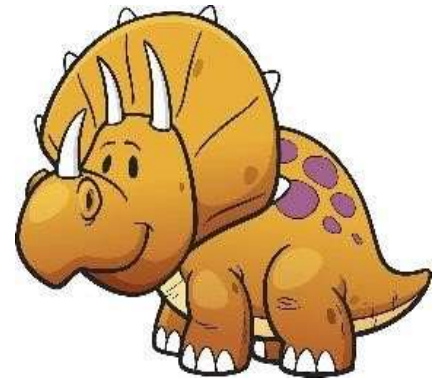
Write a set of instructions on how you made your model dinosaur in Lesson 2. You need to include each step.

Lesson 4

Write a set of instructions on how to grow your own dinosaur. Look at the shared model below to give you some ideas:

How to Grow a Dinosaur

You will need: a large cauldron, water from the River Thames, a peacock's feather, some leaves and sticks plus a lizard's tail.



Method:

- First, heat up the cauldron and pour in the river water.
- Next, add the peacock feather.
- After that, scatter in some leaves and sticks.
- Then, drop in the lizard's tail.
- Finally, stir the mixture and repeat the name of the dinosaur you desire.
- Now, place the cauldron in the fridge.
- After two days of cooling, a dinosaur egg will have formed.

A note of warning!

Do not force the egg open because this can be dangerous for the baby dinosaur. Keep the egg warm and it should hatch within three weeks.

Important things to note:

- ✓ Make each section clear by underlining it with a ruler. The 'Final Note of Warning' is a fun extra section that you might want to include!
- ✓ Remember your commas in the 'You will need' section as this is a list.
- ✓ Use bulleted points for the method, taking a new line for each one.
- ✓ Use time adverbials in your method (e.g. first, next, after that, ...) and remember your comma after them!
- ✓ Use bossy verbs in your method, e.g. stir, pour, add...

To make your instructions more precise, you might want to name your specific dinosaur, e.g. 'How to grow a T-Rex'.

Check over your instructions from Lesson 4, making sure you have included all of the necessary punctuation, e.g. commas in a list. Then, write up your instructions in your best handwriting.
