Make a **presentation** about a famous river from somewhere around the world. e.g. The Amazon, The Nile, The Ganges.

Include information on:

- Its location
- Its size
- Its notable features
- Its wildlife
- How it is used by/impacts humans

You could present your work as a PowerPoint, poster or you could even write and record your own documentary!!


1. Researching

Create a **model** of either...

- a river landscape, or
- a coast line

Remember to label the features in some way.



Use **Google Earth** to visit the Thames Barrier and find out what it is and why it was built. Write a few sentences about what you have found out.

Create a **poster** encouraging people to look after rivers. Include tips and explain why it is important for them to follow the tips.
